Significant & Growing Demand: A Critical Market Gap

- Escalating Placements: There has been a 45% increase in child placements since 2019.
- Substantial Annual Expenditure: The UK spends £6.6 billion annually on looked-after children.
- Systemic Challenges:
 - 90% of councils are currently facing placement challenges.
 - Wait times for placements average 4 months and can even exceed 2 years for complex cases.

Targeted Demand: There is strong, urgent demand specifically for small, therapeutic homes in Lancashire.

Our Sustainable Model: High-Quality Care, Clear Returns

- Core Service: Providing high-quality, therapeutic and trauma-informed residential care.
- Revenue & Profitability:
 - Weekly Fee per Child: £7,000
 - Weekly Cost per Child: £5,000

The Market Landscape: A Critical Need for Specialized Care

• Fragmented Market Dynamics:

- Over 60% of children's homes are run by small independent providers, while larger groups focus on multi-bed, generalist models.
- Despite high overall numbers of homes (e.g., Lancashire having the highest in the UK), there's a critical shortage of specialist, small-scale, therapeutic placements for children with complex emotional and behavioural needs.

Systemic Dysfunction & Poor Outcomes:

- The market is characterized as "dysfunctional" by the CMA, with surging Local Authorities spend per child (£6,108 average weekly cost, up 55% since 2019) not correlating with complexity of need.
- Outcomes for care leavers remain poor: 41% NEET, and up to 24% of homeless/prison populations are care-experienced.

Escalating Demand & Costs:

- The number of children in care is projected to rise from **84,000 (2023) to 86,000-93,500 by 2026.**
- National expenditure on children's services is projected to soar by 74% to £21.4bn by 2029-30, with children looked after alone rising 82% (£6.6bn to £12bn)

Direct Alignment with Market Need:

- Our **3-bedded therapeutic model** is specifically designed for children with complex needs, directly addressing the critical demand for smaller, specialized settings.
- •Validated by Local Data: Between Oct 2024 Mar 2025, 57% of Lancashire children moving into agency homes were placed in 3-bedded settings or less, proving our model's direct market fit.

Our Pillars of Success:

- Specialized Therapeutic Care (PACE, Trauma-Informed): Delivering highly tailored care, in contrast to generalist models.
